What were Paul’s great passions? Faith unto life, knowledge unto godliness.

Paul labors for the faith of the chosen which results in eternal life, and for the knowledge of the truth in the word, which leads to godliness.

Paul exhorted Titus to set in order the church in Crete by proclaiming the truth, by appointing godly leaders, by refuting error, and challenging all believers to a godly life which adorns the doctrine of God (2:10).

The key verses may be:

“For this reason I left you in Crete, that you might set in order what remains, and appoint elders in every city as I directed you . . . For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age.” Titus 1:5; 2:11, 12 NASB
