Though fearful of the LORD and His work, Habakkuk prays for His work to be done and by faith triumphs over his fears and the circumstances of life.

The righteous by faith shall live, and so the righteous should live by faith. The book began in a valley of despair, and ends with the prophet revived and triumphant, walking on his high places.

Lessons:

- The righteous by faith pray about their problems.
- God may allow the evil for a time.
- God may even use the evil to accomplish His work, He is sovereign. Psalm 103:19
- God’s apparent delay to judge the evil may be an opportunity to repent. 2 Peter 3:9
- God will judge the evil. Habakkuk 1:11; 2:12-20
- God will deliver the righteous by faith, they will live. Habakkuk 2:4
- God will triumph with His anointed. Habakkuk 3:13
- The righteous by faith pray for His will
- The righteous by faith may still have fears.
- The righteous by faith can triumph over their fears and the trials of life.
